- 1.) Applied Internship in Psychology (Service-Learning Designation). F2F, (Hybrid and/or Asynchronous/ Online from 2020).

This course is designed to provide students with the opportunity to apply knowledge and skills gained from classes to work settings while under both site and academic supervision.

2.) Cognitive- Behavioral Therapies [Originally, Behavior Modification] (Writing Intensive

(WI). F2F, Asynchronous/Online since 2020.) This course is designed to teach students how to apply the theoretical and psychological principles of Cognitive-Behavioral Therapies to create constructive behavior change. Behavior Modification, Cognitive Therapy, EMDR, Positive Psychology, and Choice Theory/ Reality Therapy models are included intervention approaches. A Cognitive-Behavioral Self- Change Project is required by each student to demonstrate their understanding of the use of Cognitive-Behavioral principles. MiniVideos

for each Module clarify course guidelines, and suggested pace. Additional MiniVideos created

for Project: Baseline and Intervention, and Choice Theory component.

- 3.) Adolescent Psychology-F2F, (Asynchronous/Online since 2020). This course is designed to help students understand how adolescents develop in contemporary society and the world in which they live- families, peer groups, schools, neighborhoods, and work and leisure settings. Discussion Boards, Reflection Papers and Quizzes help students better understand and integrate the concepts. MiniVideos for each Module clarify the course guidelines, and suggested pace.
- 4.) Applied Internship in Psychology (Service-Learning Course.). This course is designed to provide students with the opportunity to apply knowledge and skills gained from classes to work settings while under both site and academic supervision. An Applied Internship Poster Event is held each semester. Faculty, Staff from their sites, and a few family members and significant others, attend this event bi-annually.
- 5.) Cognitive- Behavioral Therapies [Originally, Behavior Modification] (Designated Writing-Intensive (WI) Course.) This course is designed to teach students how to apply the theoretical and psychological principles of Cognitive-Behavioral Therapies to create constructive behavior change. Behavior Modification, Cognitive Therapy, EMDR, Positive Psychology, and Choice Theory/ Reality Therapy models are included intervention approaches. A Behavioral change project is required by each student to demonstrate their understanding of the use of cognitive-behavioral principles.
- 6.) <u>Adolescent Psychology</u>- This course is designed to help students understand how adolescents develop in contemporary society and the world in which they live- families, peer groups, schools, neighborhoods, and work and leisure settings. Panel Discussions with an interactive component ate part of this class.
- 7.) Reality Therapy/Choice Theory- (Designated a Writing- Intensive Course.) This course is designed to provide students with the theoretical underpinnings of the Choice Theory/ Reality Therapy approach developed by Dr. William Glasser. Discussed in this class is Glasser's notion of 'Total Behavior', and how the choices we make impact all aspects of our lives, and improve our health, quality of life, and especially, our relationships with others. Cognitive Therapy models and the Humanistic, Person-Centered Counseling models, are included as comparative approaches.
- 8). Adolescent Psychology- This course is designed to help students understand how adolescents develop in contemporary society and the world in which they live- families, peer groups, schools, neighborhoods, and work and leisure settings. Group discussions-small and large- help to enhance the learning process. Panel Discussions on controversial issues related to Adolescence are included in the course.
